He was a member of the State Bar of Oklahoma.

A highly regarded veteran of the insurance industry, Brian's true passion was the London Marketplace. He considered it a privilege to serve Underwriters at Lloyds. Known as a great mentor, he cultivated a team of skilled attorneys and support staff who will continue to deliver the exceptional claims administration and litigation management services that TransEleven clients have come to expect.

Brian built more than a company, he built a brand. He will always be remembered by his staff and colleagues for his even temperament, keen knowledge of insurance coverage, his generous spirit and an infectious love of life and "all things London".

Beyond his talent as an attorney and President of TransEleven, Brian was a devoted husband and father of three beautiful children, Dyson, Davis and Evie.
